As the operator of Long Lake, Nexen is engaged in developing a bountiful resource with a long lifespan and tremendous future growth potential. Recoverable bitumen reserves and resources on the Long Lake lease are independently estimated in excess of two billion barrels – enough to sustain production of more than 70,000 barrels per day for over 40 years.

A key component of our success in this undertaking involves building mutually beneficial relationships and improving the quality of life within the communities where we do business.

We seek to do so by:

- Investing in non-profit, community-driven initiatives that build local capacity and capability; communicating actively and resolving issues with input from local individuals and organizations; and providing significant opportunities for local employment, training and business development.
- Our community investments fall into five categories: Education & Training, Community Development, Environment, Health & Wellness, and Culture, Arts & Recreation. Major investments include \$1.5 million to enhance education at a new community school, \$1 million for future post-secondary scholarships and \$150,000 for an Indoor Running Track at Fort McMurray's Keyano College.
- Long Lake employs a consultation team whose responsibility is to ensure strong, ongoing communication. Activities include open houses, contractor workshops, working with educational institutions to promote skill development, and daily contact with stakeholders through our Anzac Community Office.
